*eerlijk*

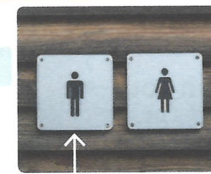
'I didn't put salt in your coffee. Honest!'

*man*

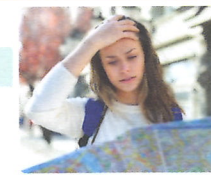
If you are male, you have to go to that loo.

*eigenschappen, karakter*

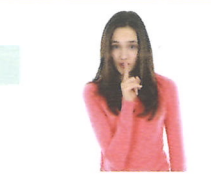
My cat's qualities? Friendly and clever.

*moe*

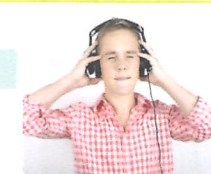
I have played football all day long, so now I am tired.
