*temperatuur*

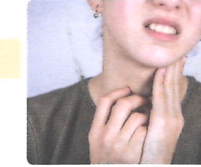
My temperature is too high. I think I have the flu.

*keel*

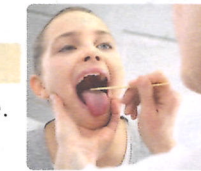
I have a sore throat. I can barely speak.
